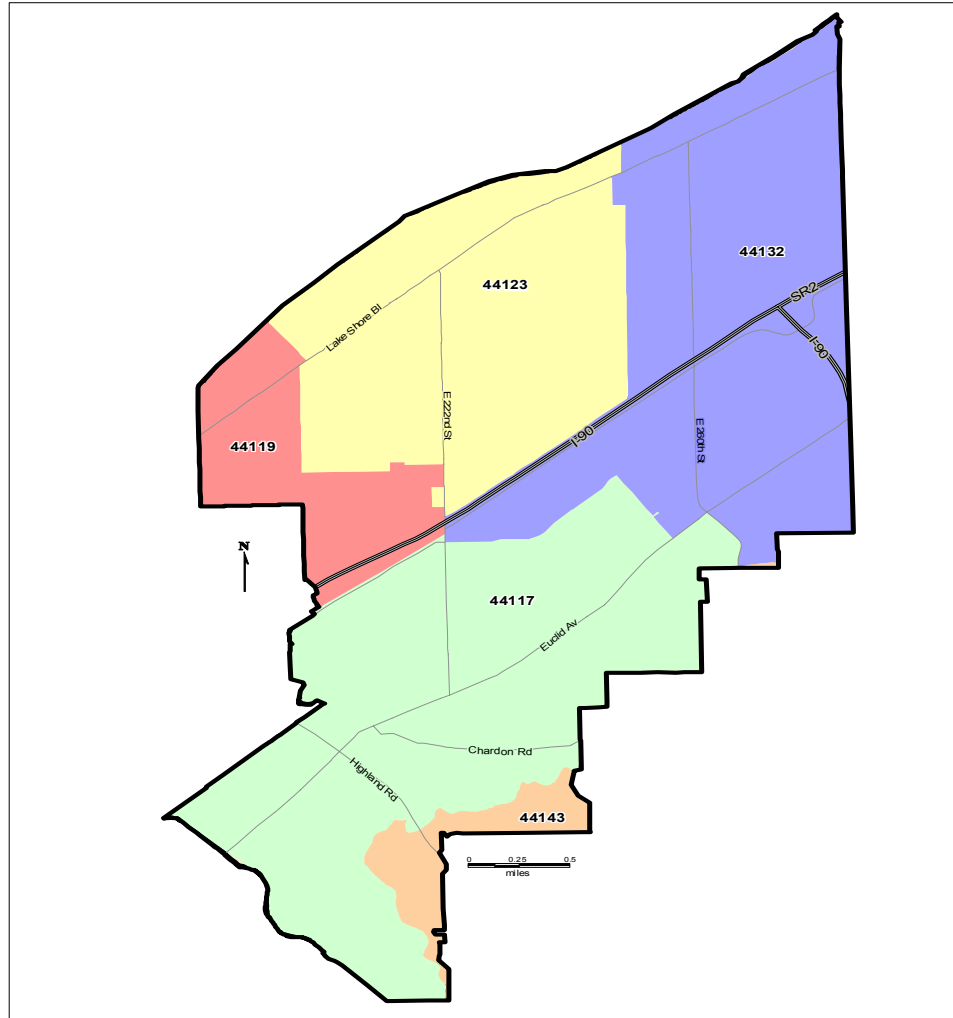
We will promote community awareness, education, and the quality of life through a comprehensive networking of community services and on - going collaboration.

HISTORY: The Euclid Collaborative was established in 2000 to connect families of all sizes to services that help meet their needs. We do this by getting out into the community, learning what our different businesses and agencies have to offer and building a relationship with them.

In 2004, the Collaborative partnered with the YMCA of Greater Cleveland, (Euclid Family YMCA). This partnership allowed staff to continue connecting families with resources but also to provide **Wraparound services**.

Wraparound is a strengths based process that assists a family to achieve their ultimate goals. The process is done by “wrapping” a team of supportive people and resources around a family to help them get to where they strive to be. This process is used to help families progress and eliminate the need for outside agencies to be involved in their life.
